### **ENGLISH**

### Literacy

- Mechanics of writing
- Capitalisation
- Punctuation
- Nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs
- Simple and compound sentences
- Handwriting
- Phonic knowledge

- High frequency words
- Spelling skills
- Vocabulary

### **Persuasive**

Students listen to, read, and view a range of persuasive texts to explore the language and structural features of persuasion. They explore persuasive techniques and the organisation of arguments. Additionally, students explore how to express a preference with reasons by practising crafting their own persuasive arguments to support their viewpoints.

**Assessment:** Students write a persuasive response.

### **SCIENCE**

### **Changes Around Me**

### Students:

- Describe the observable features in the sky and within various landscapes
- Consider changes in the sky and landscape and the impact on themselves and other living things
- Represent observable features and communicate their understandings

Assessment: End of term test

### THE ARTS Semester 2

### Media

### Students:

- Develop awareness of structure, intent, character and settings
- Use media elements such as sound, pictures, photos and text
- Share their media artwork with peers and experience media artworks as an audience

**Assessment:** Students use Book Creator to create media artworks that communicate an explanation to an audience.

### Music

- Sing and play instruments to improvise and practise a repertoire of chants, songs and rhymes
- Create compositions and perform music to communicate ideas to an audience
- Respond to music and consider where and why people make music including music of our First Nations Peoples

### My Changing Life

Students demonstrate fundamental movement skills of striking a ball from varied starting positions.

Students focus on:

- Connection with ball
- Follow through

# Protective Behaviours - Body Safety

Students:

- Review emotional and physical warning signs about body safety
- Suggest and practise how to stay safe

Assessment: Written Tasks

### **MATHEMATICS**

### Number and place value

- Recognise, model, read, write and order two- and three-digit numbers
- Count and represent collections to 120
- Understand place value, hundreds, tens and ones
- Identify parts and whole of quantities
- Rename two-digit numbers
- Position and locate numbers on number lines
- Connect addition and subtraction- fact families
- Record and solve addition and subtraction problems
- Revise zero, double, rainbow, and count on and count back facts

### Patterns and algebra

- Count, represent and record counting sequences in ones, twos, fives and tens
- Describe number sequences resulting from skip counting by 2s, 5s and 10s from any number
- Skip count by 10s on and off the decade to at least 120

### Measurement

Measure and compare the length and mass of objects

### Shape

- Identify, compare and describe the attributes of two- and three-dimensional shapes
- Explain the similarities and differences of shapes
