Information Report

Students listen to, read, and view a variety of reports from different sources.

They identify and analyse the language features and structure of informative reports, such as headings, subheadings, technical vocabulary, and visual aids. Students evaluate the effectiveness of language devices used to represent information with the intent to inform an audience accurately and engagingly.

HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES (HASS)

Semester 2

British Settlement in Australia

Inquiry question:

What were the effects of British Settlement?

Students:

- Explore the diversity of different groups within their local community
- Examine the purpose of laws and distinguish between rules and laws
- Make connections between world history events between the 1400s and the 1800s, and the history of Australia, including the reasons for the colonisation of Australia by the British
- Investigate the experiences of British explorers, convicts, settlers and Australia's first peoples, and the impact colonisation had on the lives of different groups of people
- Analyse the experiences of contact between Australia's first peoples and others, and the effects these interactions had on people and the environment
- Draw conclusions about how the identities and sense of belonging for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the past and present were and continue to be affected by British colonisation and the enactment of law of terra nullius.

Media

Students explore and compare various magazine cover designs, analysing elements such as layout, typography, imagery, and colour schemes. They examine how these elements attract and engage readers, convey the magazine's theme, and target specific audiences. After gaining insights from their analysis, students create their own magazine cover, incorporating effective design principles and creative elements to appeal to their chosen audience.

Assessment: Collection of Work

Music

Students practise singing, playing instruments and improvising music, using elements of music including rhythm, pitch, dynamics and form in a range of pieces. They create, perform and record compositions by selecting and organising sounds, silence, tempo and volume. Students identify intended purposes and meanings as they listen to music using the elements of music to make comparisons.

SCIENCE

Here Today, Gone Tomorrow

Students explore natural processes and human activity that cause weathering and erosion of the Earth's surface. Students relate this to their local area, make observations and predict consequences of future occurrences and human activity.
